


DON'T MISS OUT-

(Sorry I didn't get a picture sooner before since folks left.)









HOT Day 2 = Fun, Friends, Food, & Great Weather!

Arkansas Traveller 100 Volunteer Appreciation Picnic & Special Awards Ceremony

It takes a lot to host this event and the race director spends a lot of time throughout the year planning and preparing. However, all of those plans mean nothing without runners and volunteers. We are so fortunate to have so many people in our running community who are dedicated to helping ensure the success and longevity of this very special event. This annual picnic that we host is our opportunity to acknowledge the efforts of every single volunteer. It is our opportunity to reverse the roles and serve the volunteers and to say thank you to everyone who made this race possible. WE truly could not have done it without you. From Chris, who helped me coordinate volunteers, those who helped me set up the great hall, volunteers at aid stations and the start finish, HAM radio operators, our finish line timers, volunteers who cleaned the course before and after, our team who did all of the trail marking just to take it all down days later, our incredible sag wagon team, to our HQ graveyard crew and clean up crew. We also owe much gratitude to Joe Jacobs with Arkansas Outside for capturing the start line and Debbie Rigsby for giving up a nights sleep on her birthday in order to take photos of our runners at the finish line. The picnic is also an opportunity for us to thank our land managers, sponsors, and organizations that lend a hand on race weekend. Central Arkansas Water, Pinnacle State Park, US Forest Department, Baptist Health, and CAREN.

This year I presented plaques and enamel buckles to our retiring volunteers, Lou and Charley Peyton and Rosemary Rogers for three decades of service to the Arkansas Traveller 100. Lou and Charley started the race and served for 10 years as race directors before stepping down to a captains role. They served as captains at several aid stations before settling at the Lake Sylvia aid station where they always had a fun theme and plenty of love for our runners. CAREN is the radio club that comes out every year, staging HAM operators at every aid station to ensure every runner is accounted for throughout the entire duration of the event. They are the source of communication between the race director and key volunteers on course. They do not sit directly at the aid station but rather off to the side so they can hear clearly what comes over the radio. Because of this they are often overlooked. Hopefully we do a good job educating so our runners are aware and say thanks to them on their way in and out of aid stations. The Hash certainly bring the fun every year but they also know how to tend to those late night runner issues, how to lift a runners spirits and how to get them moving towards the finish line. Ms Linda, is another volunteer that often gets overlooked by runners. She sits at the finish line every year to carefully collect the bib numbers and finish times of every single runner. Ms Linda, CAREN, and LR Hash have been with us from the beginning and are all committed to continuing their service to the trail community and we are extremely grateful!!


